- **Thursday, September 22, 2022** -
 - Membership must be current to upload any audition materials.
 - Postmark/Online Deadline - Mail your All-State Orff Audition Packet to *FEMEA All-State Auditions/P.O. Box 4657/Winter Park, FL 32793* **OR** submit online - scan and save as PDF titled in the format “School Name-Student Name”, and email all forms to *OrffPaperwork@femea.flmusiced.org*
 - Upload Deadline - Upload your All-State Orff audition video to the FEMEA website.
- **Wednesday, October 5, 2022** - Goal is to post results by 5:00 pm.
- **Wednesday, October 19, 2022** - Postmark/Online Deadline - participation materials and fees for those accepted.

Teacher Eligibility

Any music teacher who wishes to audition students enrolled in a DOE course that he/she personally teaches, for the FMEA All-State Elementary Orff Ensemble **MUST** pay NAFME, FMEA and FEMEA dues before uploading any auditions. The music teacher must hold full active membership in FEMEA. **Each FEMEA member may audition an unlimited number of students for the FMEA All-State Elementary Orff Ensemble. Only 5 students per school will be accepted into the ensemble.**

Student Eligibility

Elementary students with unchanged voices in 4th and 5th grades that are currently participating in an elementary school or home-school association music program.

- Sign a participant contract in which the student agrees to demonstrate appropriate behavior while at the Tampa Convention Center.
- Memorize all music by January 12, 2023.
- Wear black dress pants or slacks, a black long-sleeved t-shirt (provided) and black low-heeled or flat dress shoes with black socks for the concert performance.

2023 Fees

Signatures

- Obtain one complete application form with **original** signatures for each student. Keep these signed applications on file until the conclusion of the All State event.
- Enclose the Invoice/Teacher Contract, signed by you and your principal.
- **Enclose original signed student participation contracts.**

Secure Payment

- Secure audition fees from each nominated student.
- Communicate with your Bookkeeper/PTA as to their process to make payment to FEMEA.
- Make payments to FEMEA following directions above. Enclose check or confirmation of credit card payment with your paperwork submission.

Submissions

- Print online-generated Orff application forms to send home with your students for parents/guardians and to sign and fill in or change information. If you don't have all the information needed prior to printing the forms, enter what you have. Information added or changed on the forms by the parents must also be added or changed in the website.
- An online Invoice/Teacher Contract will be generated and must be printed and signed by the teacher and principal.
- For online submission, scan original documents and save as PDFs. Attach all PDFs in an email to OrffPaperwork@femea.flmusiced.org . Be sure to include credit card payment confirmation.
- If mailing, please use a large envelope to prevent folding of documents. **Please do not send additional copies.**
- Submit following the directions above.

Copies

- Retain a hard copy of your paperwork for your records. No additional copies are required to be sent.

Preparation

Tips for Success

- Prepare all audition music with students. Consider printing and using rubric for self-check and teacher-evaluation prior to recording.
- Prepare yourself for recording the audition by reading all instructions carefully.
- Secure an Orff-style alto xylophone (no concert xylophones).
- Practice making recordings from the device being used. Remember to set the phone in landscape mode and check audio.

Audition Material

Teacher Directions

1. Set up a device to record audition (phones in landscape view)
2. Start the recording (any pauses or stops in recordings can result in disqualification).
3. There are no verbal prompts given by the teacher during recording.
4. The student will perform the prepared body percussion piece, “Sleep Tight.” **First time with speech and body percussion. Second time with body percussion only.**
5. Be sure the student is closer to the microphone than the teacher during “America, America” The student’s voice should be dominant on the video.
6. The final part of the audition is the prepared song on alto xylophone.
7. Memorization is not required.
8. **Students' faces are allowed to be seen. Teachers and school names are not to be seen or spoken on camera.**

Audition

Ensure your video is in the required .mov or .mp4 format and turn any phone to landscape mode.
More detailed information is on the website

1. Before you turn on the video, Teacher says; “We are going to make a video for the FMEA All-State Orff Ensemble audition. When I start the video, we will record the entire audition without stopping the recording. Do not say your name, my name, or our school name during the recording.”
2. Start the video.

Part 1: Prepared Body Percussion – “Sleep Tight”

3. Student performs “Sleep Tight” alone.
First time speech + body percussion. Second time body percussion only.

Part 2: Sing in Canon – “America, America”

4. Teacher plays starting pitch (D) one time. Do not play the melody or sing the pitch.
5. Student sings “America, America” *a cappella* one time. As the student begins the third full measure, the teacher enters to create the round.

Part 3: Play with Mallets – “Mallet Piece”

6. Student plays “Mallet Piece” alone.

7. Teacher turns off the camera. Audition ends.

Avoiding Audition Errors

Paperwork Errors

- Your paperwork is incomplete.
- Requisitions, purchase orders, or personal checks are used as payment for the audition fees.

Deadline Errors

- The audition is not uploaded **by** September 22.
- The audition paperwork is sent **after** September 22.

Recording Errors

- The recording cannot be adequately viewed/heard due to incorrect format, static or distortion.
- Teacher sings the starting pitch and/or gives a count-in.
- A metronome used during the audition recording.
- If recording is stopped or paused during the audition.
- Auditions that are uploaded to the FEMEA website in an incorrect format.
- If the name of the student, teacher, or school is mentioned or seen on the audition.
- If the video is not recorded in landscape mode.
- Incorrect instruments used.
- If the song/exercise are not the correct ones or are not completed.

Audition Submission

Computer Requirements

- See detailed Macintosh and Windows directions at femea.flmusiced.org.

Recording Devices

- Computers, Phones, Tablets
- Windows Live Movie Maker, VideoPad, or iMovie
- Hold your device sideways. *No vertical video!*

Upload/Data Transfer

- .mov or .mp4 format
- No bigger than 854 x 480 resolution. If 854 x 480 is not an option, choose 540p or the lowest one possible.
- Login to FMEA website and look under the “FEMEA” heading on the members-only page

Looking Ahead

Audition Results

- The 2023 All-State list will be posted on a password-protected section of the FEMEA website, femea.flmusiced.org, on October 5, 2022.
- An adjudication panel of at least three judges will select approximately 80 - 100 students to participate in the FMEA All-State Orff Ensemble.
- All judges’ decisions are final. No audition recordings will be re-heard.
- Due to logistical restraints and confidentiality constraints, we are unable to give individual feedback.
